Lincoln Elementary is a Granite School District school in the City of South Salt Lake. United Way of Salt Lake partners with the school, district, city, and various other partners to provide intentional, aligned resources for families. Lincoln serves approximately 530 students and is a Title I school. Ninety-five percent of students qualify for free and/or reduced price lunch. Lincoln has a diverse population comprised of many immigrant and refugee families. Approximately 25 languages are spoken at the school and 75 percent of students are English Language Learners.

Our Goal

Lincoln Elementary School is a professional learning community working together so that every child excels toward college and career readiness, perseveres in a safe, consistent learning environment, is accountable for personal growth, and values diversity and creativity. As a staff, we are working toward the high goals set in order to complete our school's turnaround. Last year, we had the highest growth of all Title 1 schools in Granite School District.

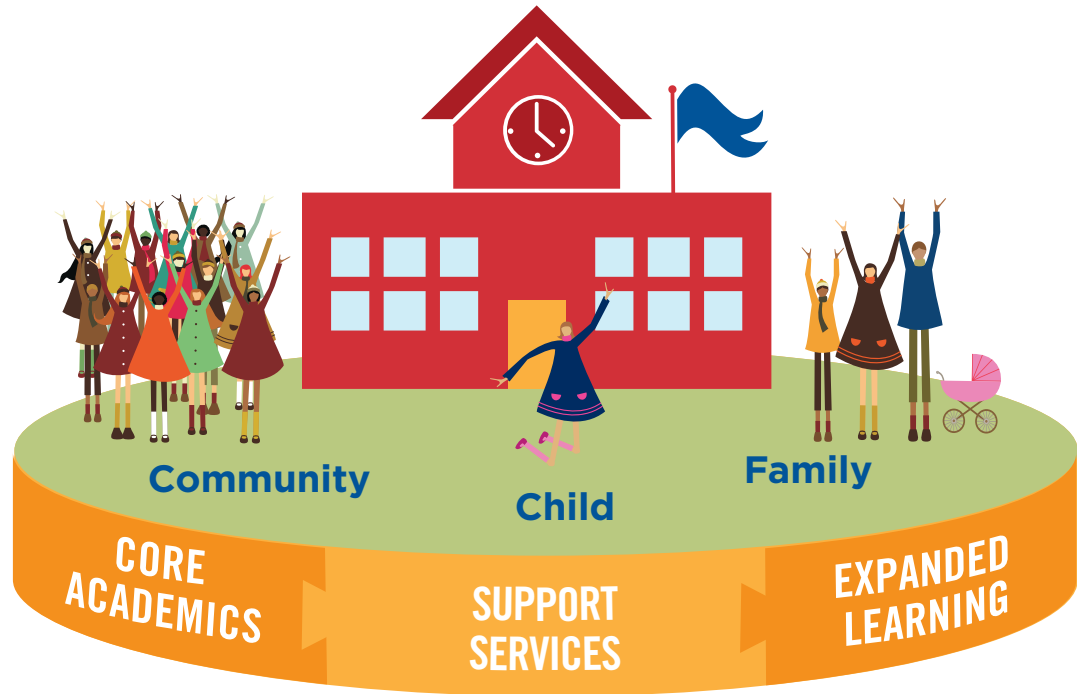
