West Kearns Elementary School: 4900 S 4620 W, Kearns, UT 84118	Working with preschool students	Mon between 8:45- 11:45 a.m.; any day Mon - Thurs between 12:30- 3:30 p.m. Volunteers should commit to at least 30 min. per week	West Kearns serves 700 students, and 80% qualify for free/reduced lunch. West Kearns has a diverse population; 1/3 of students are English-Language Learners Volunteers help the preschool teacher by doing activities with students.
South Kearns Elementary School: 4430 W 5570 S, Kearns, UT 84118	Working with preschool students	any day Mon - Thurs, 9:00-11:00 a.m. or 12:45-2:45 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 2 hours per week.	South Kearns serves more than 300 students with 80% qualifying for free/reduced lunch. About 58% percent of students are minorities, and 35% are English Language Learners. Volunteers help the preschool teacher by doing activities with students.
West Kearns Elementary School: 4900 S 4620 W, Kearns, UT 84118	Math tutoring with elementary students	any day Mon - Thurs, 9:00-9:55 a.m. or 10:55- 11:40 a.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for the semester.	West Kearns serves 700 students, and 80% qualify for free/reduced lunch. West Kearns has a diverse population; 1/3 of students are English-Language Learners. Volunteers work 1-on-1 or in small groups with students under the supervision of the teacher to review math facts and increase math fluency.
James E. Moss Elementary School: 4399 S 500 E, Salt Lake City, UT 84107 (Millcreek)	Reading tutoring with elementary students	any day Mon - Thurs between 9:00 a.m 1:00 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1-2 days a week for the semester.	Moss Elementary serves 600 students, and 94% qualify for free/reduced lunch. Over 35 languages and 51 countries are represented in the school. Volunteers work 1-on-1 with students doing simple reading exercises.
Mill Creek Elementary School: 3761 S. 1100 E., Salt Lake City, UT 84106 (Millcreek)	Reading tutoring with elementary students	Any day Mon - Fri between 8:40 a.m 3:20 p.m. except Fri school ends at 1:15 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 30 minutes, preferably weekly	Mill Creek Elementary serves 450 students, and 60% qualify for free/reduced lunch. Over 25 languages are spoken with 35% of students being English Language Learners. Volunteers work 1-on-1 with students doing simple reading exercises. All volunteers will need to attend an orientation and pass the Granite School District background check (fingerprinting included).
Granite Park Junior High School: 3031 S 200 E, Salt Lake City, UT 84115 (South Salt Lake)	Reading tutoring with junior high students	Mon / Wed or Tues / Thurs, 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. or 3:00 - 4:00 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 2 days a week for semester.	Granite Park is rich in diversity with speakers of 44 languages representing 60 countries. About 90% of students are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Volunteers work 1-on-1 with students and supervised by a trained reading tutor. Volunteers read texts with the student and help with word composition.

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Granite Park Junior High School: 3031 S 200 E, Salt Lake City, UT 84115 (South Salt Lake)	Math tutoring with junior high students	Mon / Wed or Tues / Thurs, 7:40 - 9:00 a.m., 12:20 - 1:35 p.m., or 1:30 - 2:45 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1-2 days a week for semester.	Granite Park is rich in diversity with speakers of 44 languages representing 60 countries. About 90% of students are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Volunteers go into classrooms to learn a lesson with students and then go around working with students as they practice what they have just learned.
East Midvale Elementary School: 6990 S 300 E, Midvale, UT 84047	Recreational activities with elementary students	any day Mon/Wed/Fri, 11:15 a.m 12:45 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for the semester.	Nearly 600 students attend East Midvale Elementary with 100% qualifying for free/reduced lunch. 20% are English Language Learners. Volunteers work with the Playworks Coach to run structured games at recess. The school embraces Recess RICH (Respect, Inclusion, Community, Healthy play) and believes that these types of activities significantly reduce the number of behavior problems during recess and during the school day.
Copperview Elementary School: 8449 S Monroe St, Midvale, UT 84047	Recreational activities with elementary students	any day Mon-Thurs, 12:00 - 1:15 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for the semester.	About 70% of the 450 students at Copperview, a Title I school, are ethnic minorities, and 41% are learning English as a second language. Volunteer to work with the Playworks Coach to run structured games at recess. Schools find that these types of activities significantly reduce the number of behavior problems during recess.
Hillcrest High School: 7350 S 900 E, Midvale, UT 84047	Reading tutoring and mentoring with high school students	any day Mon-Fri between 7:50 a.m 12:35 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for at least 1 hour.	Hillcrest High School's promise is to prepare all students for the rigors of college and careers. More than a third of Hillcrest's 2,050 students are ethnic minorities, and 40% qualify for free/reduced lunch. Volunteers will tutor, mentor, and converse with students learning English by reading with them and helping them practice simple sentences.
South Salt Lake community centers (various throughout South Salt Lake City)	Afterschool mentoring, tutoring, and recreational activities with all ages	any day Mon - Fri various after school times including after 5:00 p.m. Commitment is flexible	South Salt Lake offers afterschool programs at centers throughout the city. Volunteers help students with homework and then with fun activities. Attend a 1-hour orientation on the 1st or 3rd Friday of the month at 3:00 or 5:00 p.m. at the Promise South Salt Lake Office (3rd Floor at City Hall: 220 Morris Ave #200, SLC). Adults must pass a background check. Teen volunteers (16-17) must complete a minor consent form.
Lincoln Elementary School: 450 E 3700 S, South Salt Lake, UT 84115	Afterschool reading tutoring and homework help with elementary students	any day Mon - Thurs, 3:30-4:30 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 hour per week for the semester.	Lincoln serves 650 students, and is a Title I school with 95% of students qualifying for free/reduced lunch. The school has a diverse population comprised of many immigrant and refugee families. 25 languages are spoken at the school, and a majority of students are English Language Learners. Volunteers work in the afterschool program helping students with reading and homework.

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Woodrow Wilson Elementary School: 2567 Main St, Salt Lake City, UT 84115	Afterschool Big Brothers Big Sisters mentoring with elementary school students	every Thurs, 4:30-5:30 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 hour per week for entire school year.	Woodrow Wilson serves 550 students, and 90% qualify for free/reduced lunch. Woodrow Wilson has a diverse population comprised of many immigrant and refugee families with 32 languages spoken at the school and 60% of students being English Language Learners. High school or college volunteers (preferred) are paired with elementary students to do activities.
Guadalupe School: 1385 N 1200 W, Salt Lake City, UT 84116 (Rose Park)	Adult English tutoring with small groups	any day Mon - Thurs 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for 2 hours	Volunteer teach English to adult immigrants and refugees at Guadalupe School. Volunteers attend a 1-hour orientation, observe other tutors, and then start tutoring in small groups!
Davis Community Learning Center: 210 E Center St, Clearfield, UT 84015	Adult English tutoring with individuals	any day Mon - Thurs between 9:00 a.m 1:00 p.m. Volunteers should commit to 1 day a week for 1-2 hours.	Volunteers tutor adult English learners 1-on-1 at Davis Community Learning Center. Volunteers fill out an application, receive training and materials, and are matched with a student.
