## SB165 Economic Mobility Initiative

## SB165 creates the Raising Expectations through Accountability, Community, and Hope Initiative, or REACH

### Purpose

Create a grant program to support “community-based partnerships” across Utah that align locally driven community efforts into a unified economic mobility plan that will significantly **improve youth and family outcomes** (like third grade reading, high school graduation, self-sufficiency)

### Grant Types

1

#### Partnership Development & Planning

up to \$300K grants to solidify a cross-sector partnership and to develop an economic mobility plan

2

#### Implementation & Scaling

up to \$2.5M grants to implement an economic mobility plan focused on driving and scaling impact

### Administration/ Accountability

**Grants are administered through a nonprofit technical assistance provider** chosen through a competitive process by the Governor’s Office of Economic Opportunity. They must be a Utah-based technical assistance provider with capacity and expertise in community based, cross-sector partnerships. This is similar to how Florida administers their program

### Measurement and Reporting

Through transparent, publicly available dashboards, data is segmented by region, community, neighborhood, school, strategy, and outcome. Investor updates and **an annual accountability report provide streamlined results to both public and private sector funders**

### Appropriation

**\$5M** in the first year to leverage **\$100M** in direct local and national philanthropic funding
