Code Blue Alert Information

What is Code Blue?

A Code Blue Alert is enacted when temperatures in a county are expected to drop to 15 degrees for 2 hours or more over the next 24 hours. Status by county can be checked online at dhhhs.utah.gov/code-blue-utah/.

What does it mean for me?

Shelters in the affected county will have expanded capacity, expedited intake, and relaxed intake requirements.

What are my rights in a Code Blue event?

Government entities may not prohibit or abate camping for an alert and may not seize any personal items for survival in cold weather.
